Dear Members,

The IBLSA has made significant progress during the year by raising its profile within industry and government. Significant achievements include the collective negotiation on the NSW LISA to ensure the commercial terms were balanced, the visibility we have created in NECS process, and gaining the attention of the WA DLI as they prepare to enter into a Broker Agreement similar to NSW, QLD and Victoria.

NECS continues to consume the majority of our attention, and is likely to continue to do so for the next period as the project moves to the COAG Business Review workgroup.

The IBLSA has been active at several levels within NECS including representation on the National Steering Committee, the National Project Team, and the Data Standards Workgroup.

The IBLSA has also successfully engaged with Victoria to modify their view on the role of a Licensed Service Provider (LSP) to the extent that they now have altered their delivery model,

The IBLSA remains agnostic to the means to deliver Electronic Conveyancing as long as there is a commercially viable model for a LSP. We will continue to promote this position to industry and government in the next period and encourage an open debate on the issues we have identified with the proposed solutions.
